בְּהַצְלָחָה	<i>b'hatzlahah</i>	Good luck
בְּסֵדֶר	<i>b'seder</i>	Okay; "in order"
בְּתֵאֵבוֹן	<i>b'tey-avon</i>	Bon appetite; enjoy your meal
בְּבִקְשָׁה	<i>b'vakashah</i>	Please; you are welcome
בְּרוּךְ הַשֵּׁם	<i>barukh hashem</i>	Thank God
הַכֹּל בְּסֵדֶר	<i>hakol b'seder</i>	Everything is okay; "Everything is in order"
כֹּל הַכָּבוֹד	<i>kol hakavod</i>	Good job; "All the respect to you"
לְחַיִּים	<i>l'hayim</i>	Cheers; "to life"
לְהִתְרָאוֹת	<i>l'hitra-ot</i>	Bye; see you later
לְבְרִיאוֹת	<i>lab'ri-ut</i>	Bless you; after a sneeze: "to health"
מַזָּל טוֹב	<i>mazal tov</i>	Congratulations; "good fortune"
נְסִיעָה טוֹבָה	<i>n'siyah tovah</i>	"Have a good trip"
רְפוּאָה שְׁלִימָה	<i>r'fu-ah sh'leimah</i>	Feel better; "a full recovery"

סְלִיחָה	<i>s'lihah</i>	Excuse me
שָׁלוֹם	<i>shalom</i>	Hello; farewell; "peace"
תּוֹדָה	<i>todah</i>	Thank you
טוֹב	<i>tov*</i>	Good
יִישָׁר כְּחֶדֶד	<i>yishar kohekh</i> colloquially pronounced: <i>yasher ko-hekh</i>	Statement made to a female in response to something done well, especially after a Torah reading or <i>d'var Torah</i> ; "May your strength be made straight"
יִישָׁר כְּחֶדֶד	<i>yishar ko-h'kha</i> colloquially pronounced: <i>yasher ko-ah</i>	Statement made to a male in response to something done well, especially after a Torah reading or <i>d'var Torah</i> ; "May your strength be made straight"
יוֹפִי	<i>yofi*</i>	Beautiful; nice
יוֹם הַוּלְדֵת שְׂמַח	<i>yom huledet</i> <i>same-ah</i>	Happy birthday
